Descripción: **The Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme**

Mission of the Programme

The Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme was launched in 2013 by the Hungarian Government with the aim of providing opportunities for international students to pursue their higher education studies in Hungary. The programme's core mission is to increase the number of international students in Hungary and encourage Hungarian higher education institutions to attract top international students.

The scholarship programme is managed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, and co-ordinated by Tempus Public Foundation. The programme is based on bilateral educational cooperation agreements signed between the Ministries responsible for education in the sending countries/territories and Hungary. Currently more than 80 Sending Partners are engaged in the programme on 5 different continents, and the programme's geographical scope is widening each year.

The scholarship program offers both full-degree and partial study opportunities in the three cycle degree structure (bachelor's, master's and doctoral programmes), mostly in the English language, however, other foreign language study programmes are also available in the framework of the Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme. Students can also apply for a one-year Hungarian language preparatory training course, following which they can pursue their higher education studies in Hungarian language.

Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship holders are encouraged to focus on their academic advancement during their stay in Hungary, as all their tuition fees are covered, and their accommodation and living costs are supported as well. Upon finishing their studies, a European degree in hand provides graduates with a wide range of opportunities in the global job market.

During the past decade, the Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship programme has become a brand in its own right, demonstrating Hungary's commitment to supporting international education and cultural exchange. The programme's success is a testament to the quality and competitiveness of Hungarian higher education and the country's commitment to science diplomacy.

Hungary has significantly increased its international development commitments Through the programme, making it a valuable tool for promoting development and growth in partner countries. The programme has also enabled Hungary to provide support and opportunities for students affected by the war in Ukraine

through the Students at Risk sub-programme, showing its flexibility and adaptability in a time of need.

The programme plays a crucial role in strengthening bilateral relations not only between Hungary and partner countries but also between higher education institutions. Additionally, the programme allows students to showcase Hungary's cultural heritage and promote cultural exchange between nations.

Since 2013, the number of Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship holders has grown significantly, at the same time increasing the ratio of self-paying international students in Hungarian universities. Between 2013 and 2019, the ratio of international students studying in Hungarian higher education institutions has doubled, and the ratio of Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship holders among them has quadrupled. As a result, the number of study programmes taught in foreign language(s) has tripled in Hungarian universities since 2015.

Available Scholarship Types

Study Levels

Stipendium Hungaricum scholarships are available for bachelor's, master's, one-tier master's, doctoral, non-degree programmes (preparatory courses) and postgraduate specialist training courses. **Please note that this Call for Application is for doctoral programmes only.** Please find here the Call for Applications for bachelor's, master's, one-tier master's, non-degree programmes and postgraduate specialist training courses here.

Important note: applications are only accepted for bachelor's, master's, one-tier master's, non-degree programmes and postgraduate specialist training courses OR for doctoral programmes; therefore please consider carefully your selected programme(s).

Supervisor

Some doctoral schools request students applying for their doctoral programmes to have a supervisor at the Host Institution, who, in the case of the successful application process, will undertake the supervising of the student's doctoral education and research activities within the frameworks of the doctoral programme chosen by the applicant. In case it is required by the doctoral programme you are applying for, a statement of acceptance issued by the supervisor must be attached to the application. **Please make sure whether the doctoral programme you are applying for requires a statement of acceptance. Naturally, if you choose two courses that require a statement of acceptance, two different statements signed by two different professors must be attached to the application.**

Available Host Institutions and Study Programmes

At doctoral level, 21 Hungarian higher education institutions are engaged in the Stipendium Hungaricum Programme for the 2023/2024 academic year, with

more than 200 study programmes, taught mainly in English; further programmes taught in Hungarian are also available for applicants with suitable proficiency.

The available study programmes and Host Institutions are available in the online application system (<https://apply.stipendiumhungaricum.hu/>). Please note that you can only apply for these study programmes within the frameworks of the Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme.

Applicants are eligible to apply only for those scholarship types and study fields that are determined in the educational cooperation programmes in effect between Hungary and the specific Sending Partner. **Please see the full list of available study fields regarding your sending country here:** <https://stipendiumhungaricum.hu/partners/>.

Applicants who are citizens of a country that has entered into a cooperation agreement with Hungary both independently and as part of a larger alliance may choose any framework but may only apply for the courses included in the given framework.

Order of Selected Study Programmes

In addition to the first choice of study programme, there is an opportunity to apply for an additional, second study programme. Therefore, each applicant can apply for **up to TWO different study programmes, in order of preference**. These two study programmes can be both at the same Host Institution and different Host Institutions; it is the applicants' decision.

The order of preference is essential. During the application process, the first selection and examination procedure will be conducted for the study programmes selected as the applicants' primary choices. These first primary choices will be considered first and then, **only the remaining free places will be filled with those applicants who are not approved for their primary choice of programmes**. In this way, the chances of receiving the scholarship are relatively higher for the study programmes selected as primary choices because there are more free places at that time.

Please note that the applicant cannot change the selected programmes (including the study language and the study mode!) and the order of preference after the application deadline! We strongly advise all applicants to carefully check the minimum entry requirements of the study programmes and take time to decide on the order of the two programme preferences. We also highly encourage the applicants to increase their chances of receiving the scholarship by applying for not only one but two study programmes in total.

Requisitos: Eligibility

1. Eligible Sending Partners

The Stipendium Hungaricum Programme is based on effective bilateral educational cooperation agreements between the Hungarian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade or its legal predecessor as regards the Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme, the Ministry of Human Capacities, and the partner's Ministry responsible for higher education. Applications will be considered eligible only if the responsible authorities of the Sending Partner nominate the applicant.

2. Non-eligibility

Applications will not be considered in the following cases:

Hungarian citizens (including those with dual citizenships), stateless persons, refugees, protected individuals, asylum-seekers, admitted individuals, migrants, settled persons, and those who do not fall within the scope of Section 39 (1) a) of the Higher Education Act

- Please note that this requirement is not only for applicants but for Scholarship Holders as well; it means that, e.g., if you obtain a Hungarian citizenship or a refugee status during your studies in Hungary, you automatically lose your scholarship status.

- Applicants with citizenship different from the sending country/territory. For example, only Brazilian citizens can apply through the Brazilian Sending Partner,
- Applicants applying for bachelor's, master's, one-tier master's and non-degree programmes within the SH programme in the same application round,
- Those former Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Holders who were **awarded scholarships for full degree studies** and who
- are now re-applying for full degree or partial (exchange) studies **in the same cycle of education** (doctoral level) **–(therefore, those Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Holders can apply for the programme who wish to continue their studies at a different cycle of education, e.g. master's student Scholarship Holders can apply for doctoral studies!)**

- or who are now re-applying for the programme for any cycles of education while they still have a scholarship status at the time of application (unless they withdraw their former scholarship before the application deadline) and will not receive their degree until 31 August 2024
- or who have postponed the start date of their scholarship studies and did not withdraw their scholarship before the current application deadline.
- Those former Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Holders who were **awarded scholarships for partial (exchange) studies** and who- are now re-applying for partial (exchange) studies in the same cycle of education (doctoral level) –(therefore, those Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Holders can apply for a different cycle of education, e.g. former master's student Scholarship Holders can apply for doctoral partial (exchange) studies if they are now doctoral students in their home countries).

Those former Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Holders who were awarded the scholarship in the 2021/22, 2022/23 or 2023/24 application round, but after accepting their scholarship, did not travel to Hungary and did not start their studies, nor did they notify Tempus Public Foundation of this fact until 31 August. This clause also applies to those former Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Holders who have postponed their scholarship awarded in the 2022/23 application round but did not travel to Hungary and did not start their studies next year, nor did they notify Tempus Public Foundation of this fact until 31 August.

Please note that it is only possible to re-apply for full degree scholarship studies in the same education cycle if the former Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Holder was previously awarded scholarship for partial (exchange) studies. Even in this case, the length of the full degree scholarship shall be reduced by the length of the previous partial (exchange) studies.

Important note for self-financed students already studying in Hungary:

Those applicants who are **registered self-financed / fee-paying students** of a Hungarian higher education institution at the time of the application deadline **AND** who are now applying for the same study level are only eligible to apply for the Stipendium Hungaricum programme if they are recommended by their Hungarian host universities where they are studying at the time of application. Based on the above, self-financed PhD students enrolled in Hungary can apply to continue their studies with the scholarship only if they are recommended by their university. Please see further details about the optional application documents in "Additional documents for self-financed applicants who wish to continue their studies with the scholarship"

Language of Study Programmes

Applicants are eligible to apply only if they meet the minimum language criteria set by their chosen Host Institution. Please visit the online application system (<https://apply.stipendiumhungaricum.hu/>) to see the exact language criteria for

each study programme. Study programmes taught in Hungarian language

1) Study programmes taught in English and other foreign languages

minimum level of knowledge - level of English proficiency determined by the Host Institution

language preparatory year - none

2) applicants with at least an intermediate (B2) level of Hungarian language knowledge

minimum level of knowledge - level of Hungarian proficiency determined by the Host Institution

language preparatory year - none if the language certificate is uploaded

3) applicants with basic or no Hungarian language knowledge

minimum level of knowledge - level of Hungarian proficiency determined by the Host Institution usually basic level

language preparatory year - yes, obligatory one-year Hungarian language preparatory course

Note about language choice in the online application system:

By default, the online application system lists the study programmes as foreign language programmes. However, if you wish to start your studies at a full degree programme in Hungarian language, you need to answer the "Would you like to perform your studies in Hungarian at the selected full degree programme?" question on the application form with "Yes, I would like to perform my studies in Hungarian at the selected full degree programme." If you select this, you can only be considered for the full degree selected programme in the Hungarian language, therefore please be cautious when filling out the online application form. If you apply for a Preparatory course in Hungarian

Provisions Covered by the Scholarship

Tuition-free education

- exemption from the payment of tuition fee

Monthly stipend

- **doctoral level:** according to the current Hungarian legislation, the monthly amount of

scholarship is HUF 140,000 (cca EUR 1 365 for the first phase of education (4 semesters) and HUF 180,000 (cca EUR 470) for the second phase (4 semesters) - for 12 months a year, until completion of studies. Please see details in section "Study Levels"

Accommodation contribution

- free dormitory place (depending on institutional capacity) or a contribution of HUF

40,000/month to accommodation costs for the whole duration of the scholarship period (Please note that if the student does not live in the dormitory, then the HUF 40,000/month is a contribution to that rental costs, and in bigger cities

–especially in the capital city –this contribution would not cover the full amount of rental costs.)

Medical insurance

- health care services according to the relevant Hungarian legislation (Act LXXX of 1997, national health insurance card) and supplementary medical insurance for up to HUF 65,000 (cca EUR 170) a year/person

Please bear in mind that these provisions are **only a contribution** to the living expenses of the Scholarship Holders. It means that it **does not fully cover the living costs** and the students need to add their own financial resources in order to cover all living expenses in Hungary. Studies in English or Other Foreign Language

Students shall have a level of proficiency in the language of education as required by the Host Institution. The applicants must directly apply for the study programmes in the online application system.

Studies in the Hungarian Language

Those applicants who wish to study in the Hungarian language must have sufficient language level. A copy of the proof of Hungarian as a foreign language knowledge must be uploaded as part of the application in the online system. The level of Hungarian language skills will be tested during institutional entrance examinations. Please note that if you apply only to Hungarian study programmes directly, but fail the language test, you cannot be admitted anywhere.

Those applicants whose language skills are insufficient to complete their studies in Hungarian shall complete an obligatory one-year preparatory language course before starting their degree courses. For this, the applicants are usually required to have at least a basic level of English proficiency. In the online application system, applicants must apply directly for the preparatory course (NOT for the degree programme they wish to start after the language preparatory year). 2) Application to Tempus Public Foundation

All applications shall be submitted through the online application system of Tempus Public Foundation. After registration, the applicants can access the application system and upload the required documents. Applications should be submitted; only saved applications will not be considered. Please note that no applications will be accepted without the online submission and after the deadline. No hard copies are required. A guide for the online system will be available to download from the www.stipendiumhungaricum.hu website.

The deadline for submitting the complete application:
15 January 2024 2 p.m. (Central European Time)

All applicants are highly advised to carefully read our Application “Dos and Don’ts” document (<https://stipendiumhungaricum.hu/uploads/2020/03/ApplicationDosandDonts.pdf>) as well as the Privacy Policy(see Statement for Application (https://stipendiumhungaricum.hu/uploads/2020/03/statement_for_application_students_at_risk_2024.pdf) (sample Annex 3) that they need to consent to in order to submit the application.

Registering with an e-mail address that works properly and that the applicant reads frequently is strongly recommended. In case there is a change in the address – including during the study period in Hungary – the host institution and Tempus Public Foundation should be immediately informed and be provided with the new e-mail address by the applicant/scholarship holder. It is always the responsibility of the applicant and the student to manage his/her e-mail account and to read the letters regularly. Tempus Public Foundation is not responsible for the malfunctioning of the registered e-mail account. Please avoid using for example a Hotmail or a Yahoo account because in that case letters from Tempus Public Foundation usually go to the Spam folder.

The information provided on the application – including the study programmes and their order of preference – cannot be changed after the application deadline. By applying, the applicant declares that all information provided in the

online application system of Tempus Public Foundation – including the content of all uploaded documents – is true and correct to the best of their knowledge and belief. The applicant can withdraw his application in the DA system at any stage of the procedure. However, this decision is final; there is no possibility to cancel the withdrawal.

Observaciones:

Application documents

A) Basic Application Documents

All of the following documents are compulsory and must be submitted to the online application surface by all applicants by 15 January 2024, 2 p.m., except for the medical certificate, which must be submitted by the nominated applicants only by **15 April**.

If applicants can not upload the statement of supervisor until **31 January 2024**, they are required to upload a declaration to the relevant task directly. In the statement applicants need to declare that they will upload the statement of supervisor until **15 March 2024**.

Online application form:

- the applicants must fill out and save all requested information on the online application form in English language
- a recent photo of the applicant (taken not earlier than 2 years before the submission of the application)
- those who apply for partial (exchange) studies must clearly state the length (indicated in months) and start date (September or February) of the studies they apply for

Motivation Letter

- minimum 1 page, typed in Times New Roman 12 point font size letters
- written in the language of the selected study programme or in Hungarian

Proof of language proficiency and their translations in the language of the selected study programme or in Hungarian

- scanned copy of the original proof of language proficiency, with a minimum level determined by the Host Institution AND its translation
- see section 2.5. for further details
- in case the student has completed his/her previous level of studies in the language of the selected study programme, proof can be uploaded about the fact that the language of education was the same as the language of the study programme that the applicant is now applying for
- translations must only be attached if the copy of the original document is not in the language of the selected study programme or Hungarian

School certificates and their translations in the language of the selected study programme or in Hungarian

- scanned copy of the original master degree certificate or equivalent AND its translation, partial (exchange) study programmes (if the partial studies are part of the student's degree studies in their sending higher education institutions): scanned copy of the original certificate about student status issued by the current higher education institution where the applicant is registered in, the document must certify that the student status is expected to exist during the partial studies as well AND its translation
- translations must only be attached if the copy of the original document is not in the language of the selected study programme or in English

Research Plan

- minimum 2 pages, typed in Times New Roman 12 point font size letters, written in the language of the selected study programme

The work plan must indicate the resources used, the document is checked by the universities for plagiarism

Letter of Recommendation

- a signed Letter of Recommendation from the applicant's former or current academic tutor or supervisor, who has a scientific degree and has an insight into the professional work of the applicant, the letter of recommendation must be written in the language of the selected study programme or in Hungarian

Statement of the Supervisor (if required by the proposed Doctoral School, see section Available Host Institutions and Study Programmes)

- a statement by the supervisor at the proposed Host Institution declaring that the supervisor undertakes to supervise the student's work within the doctoral programme (if required by the doctoral school)
- the Statement of the Supervisor (if required) must be uploaded until 15 March 2024
- declaration is required to be uploaded until 31 January 2024 (if the Doctoral School requires a Statement of Supervisor)

Transcript of Records and its translations in the language of the selected study programme or in Hungarian

- copy of the original transcript of records regarding all academic semesters or school years completed during previous studies (in the highest level of education that the student has participated in) AND its translations
- translations must only be attached if the copy of the original document is not in the language of the selected study programme or Hungarian

Copy of Identification Document

- provided that the applicant already has a passport, a scanned copy of the passport's data page should be uploaded
- in case the applicant does not yet have a passport, they should upload a scanned copy of their national ID card
- the page must be uploaded that contains both the personal data and the photograph of the applicant

Acceptance of Statement for Application in the online system

- all applicants need to accept the "Statement for Application" (https://stipendiumhungaricum.hu/uploads/2020/03/Statement_for_Application_2024.pdf)
- the statement can only be accepted in the online system, therefore scanned and signed copies should not be uploaded
- the statement appears in the online application system after registration –all applicants need to click on accepting it to be able to submit their applications

Medical Certificate

- Mandatory only for the applicants nominated by the Sending Partners
- scanned copy of a medical certificate of satisfactory health condition
- -certificates must be issued and signed by a physician to declare the medical condition of the applicant (according to the diseases listed on the form)
- - the certificate must be recently issued. It means that the date of issue on the document cannot be earlier than 1 November 2023.
- must be submitted by 15 April (the nominated applicants must submit the medical certificate, however it is possible to upload it from the beginning of the application period)

- Scholarship holders will take part in medical examinations organized by universities upon their arrival.

All documents that cannot be obtained or produced in the language of the selected study programme or in Hungarian must be translated and the translations must be submitted together with a copy of the original document.

Please note that under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) in European Union law, you need to give your consents regarding data protection and accept our Privacy Policy in order to be able to submit your application. These consents appear in the system after registration as well as the Privacy Policy –that is also Statement for Application (sample) Annex 3.

All applicants of doctoral programmes are required to visit <http://www.doktori.hu> before they submit their application. The website provides information about the Hungarian doctoral schools, available research fields and research topics as well as the possible supervisors of doctoral students in English and Hungarian language. Proposed research topics for aspiring doctoral students are available at <http://www.doktori.hu/index.php?menuid=115&lang=EN>.

Doctoral applicants are also required to contact their chosen Host Institutions and doctoral schools in advance in order to discuss the available research topics in the institution as well as the possible supervisors for those topics. All students applying for a doctoral programme must have a supervisor at their selected Host University. The list of Stipendium Hungaricum coordinators at the Host Institutions is available at <https://stipendiumhungaricum.hu/study-finder/>. These pieces of information need to be considered when preparing the application materials (e.g. research plan) and whilst choosing a doctoral programme and research area.

B) Additional Documents for Art Applicants

Besides the documents listed, applicants applying for studies in the field of Arts need to upload the following documents as well. All of the following documents are required and need to be submitted via the online application system by Art applicants until 15 January 2024, 2pm

Portfolio: photographs of three works of art / sketches (indicating the date of creation) Required to be uploaded by applicants of study programmes in the field of Arts

Please note that only files with a maximum size of 4 MB can be uploaded in the system. If the size of the portfolio is larger than 4 MB, please upload a document that contains the link(s) where the portfolio file(s) can be downloaded from.

C) Additional documents for self-financed applicants who wish to continue their studies with the scholarship

Those applicants who are registered self-financed / fee-paying students of a

Hungarian higher education institution at the time of the application deadline AND who are now re-applying for the same study level are only eligible to apply for the Stipendium Hungaricum programme in cases about non-eligibility.

Apart from the requirements about the average performance of the applicant, they need to be recommended by their Hungarian host universities where they are studying at the time of application. Therefore, we recommend all of these applicants to contact their universities and discuss whether the university wishes to recommend them for the scholarship.

If you are recommended, please request ask for a recommendation letter from the Hungarian Host Institution and upload it in to the online application system by 15 March 2024.

D) Missing Documents

All documents listed below are mandatory application documents. However, certain documents are accepted to be uploaded even after the application deadline, provided that the applicant could not possibly obtain the document by the deadline of application.

In this case, the applicants must upload a signed declaration stating that they will obtain and upload the missing document(s) by 1 August 2024 at the latest. Please note that Tempus Public Foundation provides no form for the declaration, it can be written by the Applicant No missing document will be accepted if the declaration is not uploaded by 15 January 2024, 2 p.m. and/or if the missing documents are not uploaded by 1 August 2024; thus such, applications will be rejected automatically.

The following missing documents can be submitted after the application deadline but no later than 1 August 2024

Master degree certificate (and translation)

Who can upload these documents as missing documents? only applicants registered for the last semester of their master programme

Copy of the valid passport

Who can upload these documents as missing documents? only applicants

awaiting their passport to be issued

What has to be uploaded until 15 January 2023- declaration signed by the applicant AND a copy of national ID

What has to be uploaded until 1 August 2023? copy of passport

Important note for self-financed students already studying in Hungary: Those

applicants who are **registered self-financed / fee-paying students** of a

AND who are now applying for the same study level are only eligible to apply for
